- 2. Admission to teacher internship:
  - a. Satisfactory accomplishment of content-area, standard-driven assessments,
  - b. B- or better in all professional teacher education courses,

- c. 2.500 GPA (overall, WSU and content), and
- d. Completed teacher intern application.
- 3. Exit from teacher internship:
  - a. B- or better in all professional courses,
  - b. 2.500 GPA (overall and WSU),
  - c. Successful completion of all degree requirements, and
  - d. Final university supervisor evaluation form.
- 4. Degree completion:
  - a. 2.500 GPA (overall and WSU), and
  - b. Meets all degree requirements.
- 5. Licensure recommendation:
  - a. Passes common assessments,
  - b. Passing score on Teacher Licensure Capstone,
  - c. Praxis II content test(s) passed, and
  - d. Licensure application.
