2. Admission to teacher internship:
a. Satisfactory accomplishment of content-area, standard-driven assessments,
b. $B$ - or better in all professional teacher education courses,
c. 2.500 GPA (overall, WSU and content), and
d. Completed teacher intern application.
3. Exit from teacher internship:
a. $B$ - or better in all professional courses,
b. 2.500 GPA (overall and WSU),
c. Successful completion of all degree requirements, and
d. Final university supervisor evaluation form.
4. Degree completion:
a. 2.500 GPA (overall and WSU), and
b. Meets all degree requirements.
5. Licensure recommendation:
a. Passes common assessments,
b. Passing score on Teacher Licensure Capstone,
c. Praxis II content test(s) passed, and
d. Licensure application.
