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Certificate in Hispanic Cultural Studies

Admission

This program is designed to allow students to advance their knowledge and skills of cultural analysis. This certificate is for students interested in research and teaching that investigates the ways in which culture transforms human beings, literature and language, and social structures. The program combines interdisciplinary approaches in order to understand Hispanic culture.

Admission to the certificate program requires a 3.000 GPA with 1) an earned bachelor's in Spanish or 2) another area with an advanced level of Spanish (to be determined by the program coordinator).

Current graduate students of WSU should complete the Declaration of Intent to Pursue a Graduate Certificate form through the Graduate School website (https://www.wichita.edu/graduate/) $^{\rm I}$. The admission review faculty may request any of the listed admission requirements before rendering an admission decision.
