FYIM 102C. First-Year Seminar: Community Connection: Teamwork Makes the Dream Work (3).

General education social and behavioral sciences course. Uses a hands-on project to guide first year students through the engineering design thinking process, a value-creation mindset and teamwork skills. Students collaborate with engineering professionals from industry. They demonstrate skills and knowledge by working in a collaborative team, assessing economic and societal impact, and participating in a formal project presentation. FYS student success topics contribute to overall achievement in this course and throughout a student's college career. Lessons and activities on these topics are graded. Student success topics include: time management, strengths' assessment, campus resources, campus involvement, information literacy and library skills, career development, student organizations, campus read, convocation, and a volunteer project. First-Year Seminars do not meet a divisional requirement in the pre-Fall 2024 WSU General Education program, and can only be used in Bucket 7 for General Education starting Fall 2024.
